CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP EXPERIENCES

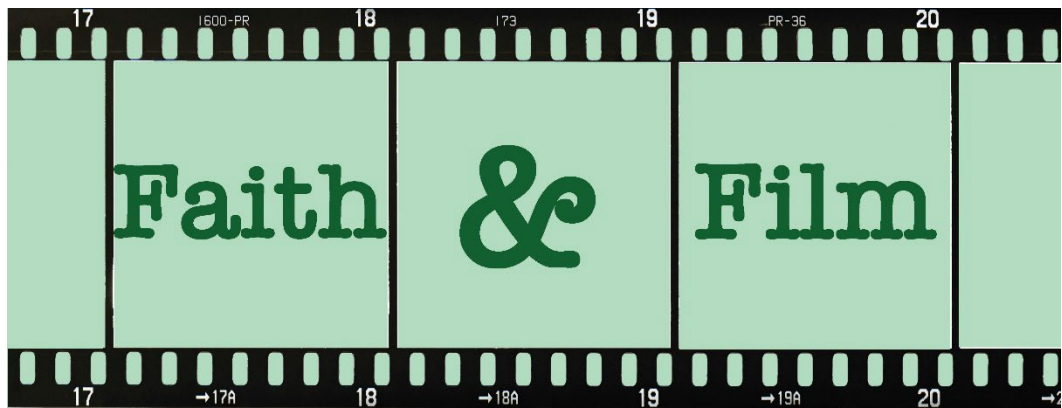
