
### WE NEED VOLUNTEERS FOR FISH DINNERS!

# LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I once asked a mentor of mine, "In a world of so many competing priorities, how do you decide where to spend your time and give your attention?"

I will never forget what he told me.

He said, "Jeff, as a follower of Jesus that answer is easy - you go where the need is the greatest."

I have always used that as a guiding principle in my life and ministry and have been blessed to be a part of churches that followed his advice. We look around and find where a need is not being met and we do our best to meet it.

The NOAH project needs socks - we collect socks. Outreach on 7th needs winter hats and gloves - we collect hats and gloves. Brightmoor needs diapers - we collect diapers.


And likewise, when a place in the world is hit hard by disaster or has been forgotten or neglected, we "lean in" in order to be of service and support where the need is greatest.

Last year the Lenten season began as war broke out in Ukraine. Following this principle that Jesus followers go where the need is greatest, the people of Royal Oak First responded and together we were able to send \$20,000 to support Ukrainian refugees.

This year, we begin our Lenten journey with the people of Turkey and Syria in our hearts. On February 6, 2023, a powerful 7.8 magnitude earthquake and a series of strong tremors and aftershocks devastated southeast Turkey (officially the Republic of Türkiye) and northwest Syria. The death toll has passed 41,000 and continues to rise. Two weeks later, on February 20, 2023, an additional 6.3 magnitude earthquake hit southern Turkey, causing additional deaths and injuries. Tens of thousands are injured and hundreds of thousands displaced across a region already beset by turmoil from the nearly 12-year conflict in Syria and the ongoing refugee crisis.

If we are going to go where the need is the greatest - then this is where we are called to go. Over the Lenten season, we will be joining United Methodists and other people of faith and good will from all around the world to raise money for the relief effort. It is our hope to raise \$10,000.
