

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

One of the failings of religion in our time and culture is that it has not given us much language for the hard emotions; feelings like sadness, anger, grief, disappointment, and even rage. We have faith almost exclusively on faith as a way to express gratitude, happiness, hope and peace. And while the exuberant and praise aspects of our faith are integral, they need not be to the exclusion of the full range of emotions, including the hard ones.

In fact, our sacred texts are full of what scholars call "the language of lament." Many of the Psalms are full of the language of sorrow and grief. Many express anger and some even dare to complain directly to God for not doing a great job of being God. We have an entire book of sorrows called Lamentation (of which I have never preached or heard preached from). Even though our sacred texts give us full license to handle these hard feelings, the community of faith has often struggled to express these full emotions in our worship and life together.

However, we miss something significant when we leave the language of lament out of our worship and community life. In his book *A Praying Life*, Paul Miller addresses this in a way that I found profoundly helpful. He says:

"We think laments are disrespectful. God says the opposite. Lamenting shows you are engaged with God in a vibrant, living faith. We live in a deeply broken world. If the pieces of our world aren't breaking your heart and you aren't in God's face about them, then...you've thrown in the towel."

The release of the police video of the murder of Tyre Nichols has shaken me. I am angry. I am sad. I am confused. I feel so powerless. I ask myself, where is God in a world that seems so bent towards violence.

Is there a way to give voice to the grief and lament we feel both personally and as a community? Jesus comes along and says, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." This Sunday, we will see what kind of wisdom Jesus is pointing us towards.
