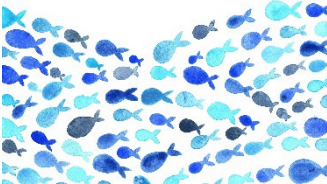


YOUTH BAKE SALE IS TODAY!
