

Join us in-person or online as we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We will be led by our House Band and our children will participate in a Palm Parade.


PALM SUNDAY BRUNCH

EGG MY HOUSE




EASTER EGG FILLERS COLLECTION

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

My neighbor and fellow church member Sue Schuldeis sent me this picture the other day. It was the first crocus of the season. Sue and I share a love of crocuses. They are one of the first signs of Spring.

The crocus is a brave little flower. Unlike the rose who waits until June when winter is safely in the rearview mirror, the crocus pushes its way through the hard and frostbitten ground to remind us that change is coming. The crocus reminds us that winter doesn't last forever.

I want to be more crocus minded. Wrongs don't work themselves out; injustices, inequities and hurts don't just dissolve. This tough little flower reminds me that somebody has to stick their neck out. Somebody has to care enough to think through and work through the hard ground. Somebody has to believe that a change of season is coming.

Easter is a lot of things. One of the things it is for sure is God's reminder that a season of discouragement and disappointment do not last forever. In the resurrection of Jesus we are reminded that God will initiate a new season of hope and renewal.

So be on the lookout for the crocus. Easter is coming!
