

EASTER EGG FILLERS COLLECTION



LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As Holy Week begins, we are saddened, shocked and angered by the shooting at Covenant School in Nashville. According to CNN, the attack was the 19th shooting at an American school or university in 2023 in which at least one person was wounded, and the deadliest since the May 2022 attack in Uvalde, Texas, left 21 dead. There have been forty-two K-12 school shootings since Uvalde.

We remember the lives of Evelyn Dieckhaus, William Kinney and Hallie Scruggs, all nine-year-old students; Cynthia Peak, believed to be a substitute teacher, Katherine Koonce, the head of the school and Mike Hill, one of the custodians.

In moments like this it feels like our world is broken beyond repair, doesn't it?

Holy Week reminds us that in Jesus, God showed up right into the midst of the mess and violence of our world. Throughout this week, we are not only reminded of God's presence in the mess, we will also be reminded that God came proclaiming a vision for a very different world and then gave us the promise that with the help of the Holy Spirit, we would actually be able to create and live in a world much more like the one God has intended.

I don't know about you, but I need to keep being reminded of this alternative vision - a world of peace with justice. A world where children can be safe in the places they learn, play and worship.

So that's what we'll do this week. We will wave palms on Sunday, share a meal on Thursday, come to the cross on Friday and gather around the empty tomb on Sunday in order to catch a glimpse of the life and world Jesus offers.

We need the hope that this week offers. We need its vision. We need its promise that in the face of death and destruction, a new world can be born.

Together, we can live in the new world that Jesus lived, died and rose again to create for us.

Please plan to join us on this journey.
