LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

What is life after Easter all about? How do we live into the new life the resurrection promises?

The scriptures tell the stories of life after Easter and in my reading and meditations upon these stories it has made two things clear:

- 1. God is at work bringing new life in people and dead places.
- 2. And God's work is slow (and that is exactly how it is supposed to be).

My realization lead me to Google the phrase "the slow work of God," thinking perhaps I had an original thought, only to find this wonderful poem written by a Jesuit priest over a century earlier.

I guess I was just slow in discovering (see what I did there!).

So as we love into this Easter life together, I simply offer this poem to you:

Trust in the Slow Work of God

Above all, trust in the slow work of God We are guite naturally impatient in everything to reach the end without delay. We should like to skip the intermediate stages. We are impatient of being on the way to something unknown, something new. And yet it is the law of all progress that it is made by passing through some stages of instabilityand that it may take a very long time. And so I think it is with you; your ideas mature gradually - let them grow, let them shape themselves, without undue haste. Don't try to force them on, as though you could be today what time (that is to say, grace and circumstances acting on your own good will) will make of you tomorrow. Only God could say what this new spirit gradually forming within you will be. Give Our Lord the benefit of believing that his hand is leading you, and accept the anxiety of feeling yourself in suspense and incomplete.
