



LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This weekend both Juneteenth and Father's Day will come together as important holiday and celebration in our culture.

Juneteenth commemorates the end of slavery in the United States and highlights the resilience, perseverance, and resistance of African-Americans in the face of oppression. It also calls all of us to continue to be engaged in the ongoing work for racial justice, civil rights and the cause of freedom in our world.

Father's Day is the moment we pause to uplift the fathers and father figures in our life. It is a day to say thank you to the fathers in our lives for the care and nurture they provided us, as well as a day to remind all fathers of the importance of being strong role models in our families and communities.
