Dear Friends.

This week we will send almost 70 young people and nearly 30 adults to our annual Church Camp. This has been our tradition for over sixty years, making camp our longest running tradition.

Camp is a week where young people are immersed in Christian community. Together they will sing, play games, do crafts and learn to think and talk about their faith. But perhaps the most important thing that happens at camp is making church friends.

Pastor Bridget has often said one of the best gifts we offer young people is the opportunity to make church friends. She has seen that as peer groups shift for young people at school, sports and clubs, church can offer a stable and consistent community of friends. And the truth is, many of these friendships were formed at camp.

One of my favorite things about camp is that older youth really embrace their roles as leaders, mentors, and faith friends of the younger kids. Both of my sons, now in high school, still talk about how cool the older youth were when they first went to camp and have now embraced that it is their turn to show the same care and attention to a new group of campers. It's how it works.

Thanks to the leadership of the Music Guild and dozens of other volunteers, this incredible tradition of camp continues to be possible.

Keep our young people and their counselors in prayer this week. And please plan to attend worship next Sunday where we will celebrate this wonderful community you have fostered throughout the years.
