


#### MOMS AT PUBS (MAP)


#### **ARTS, BEATS & EATS WORSHIP SERVICE**




#### **"THE BOOK OF JOY" BOOK DISCUSSION**

### LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

"We the church don't have a mission. The mission has a church."

Dear Friends,

I love this quote by Reggie McNeal. It reminds us that the church's mission is to be in mission. We were invited by Jesus to be in loving service to our neighbors and are called to share with each other, and the community around us, from the blessings we have been given. I have heard it said that the Church of Jesus Christ is an organization that exists for the sole benefit of its non-members.

I am proud of all the ways Royal Oak First's mission is to be in mission. Together we share God's love locally, regionally and around the world. I want to suggest three ways you can continue to make our mission of making Christ's love real.

#### Ferndale Lower Elementary:

We want to ensure that every student in this one school can start the school with all the "stuff" they need to be successful. Throughout the month of August we are collecting glue sticks, Expo markers, plastic pencil boxes, Crayola (24 count) Crayons and kids' scissors. Please drop off school supplies in the big round bins at the Tower Entrance or by the Welcome Desk. Let's make sure to get these kids off to a great start!

#### Personal Essentials Pantry:

In April of this past year we launched our newest mission, a non-food essentials pantry. We want to help low-income families get basic hygiene and cleaning products. As we know, these items can be fairly expensive. We offer this pantry on the first Saturday of every month and have had as many as 60 households receive assistance on a given Saturday. The Personal Essentials Pantry is always in need of paper towels and toilet paper. If you are at the store and are able to grab an extra pack of these items from time to time, just know that your purchase goes a long way to helping families in need.

#### Maui Wildfires:

Many of us have watched in shock and disbelief as wind-driven wildfires on Maui have devastated the local population. If you are like me, you wonder, how can I help? One of the blessings of being a part of the United Methodist Church is our offerings support a global relief organization known as the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). UMCOR is already on the ground working with local UMC Churches on the island to provide food and water, support shelters and begin the long cleanup.
