


### SANDWICH ASSEMBLY (FROM HOME)

### LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I remember once being at a workshop where the facilitator had a big bowl on the stage. The fish bowl was full of water. She then proceeded to stir several large scoops of dirt into a bowl until the once clear water was completely clouded. We no longer could see clearly because of the swirling mess.

The facilitator then went to say that this is a metaphor for how life unfolds sometimes. A lot of "stuff" can stir into our lives, making it hard to both see where we are and where we need to go. Then with a stirring stick in hand, she said our response to these cloudy moments of life is too often to keep stirring things up, as if more activity and more anxiety would bring clarity.

She then said, let's see what happens if we leave it alone for a while. And sure enough, the simple act of just leaving the mess alone, over the course of the workshop, the dirt slowly gave way to clarity.

She was making her point: Sometimes you just have to let things settle. Sometimes you just need to let it be.

I am more of a Type A personality, but over this last season of my life, I am learning to be more of a Type "Let it Be" person. Learning to let things settle. To simply let that time be is truly a spiritual act of trust. When we are able to take our hands off the "stirring stick" of our lives, we can trust that God will bring a clarity we cannot fully create on our own. Learning to sit still, breathe, listen and wait have all been practices I have had to learn (some of them the hard way!)

The Nelson family will be getting away this weekend. We are traveling to the Hocking Hills of Ohio for a few days to simply be together. We will rest. We will read. We will play some Euchre (my Type A personality still makes me pretty competitive...but I am working on it!) We will take in the sights - I am excited about seeing the Pencil Sharpener Museum! But the main thing we will be "doing" is just "being together".
