Pledge Update

I want to thank all of you for your pledge to the 2024 Operating Budget. This is a very important tool for us in planning our program and budget. Our budget last year was \$975,000. We want to underwrite the budget with 83% of pledged income so we are hoping for \$809,250 in pledges this year.

Here is where we are after one week: 81 Pledges for a total of \$273,562.00; 31 New Pledges for a total of \$61,098; Additional increased pledges totaling: \$17,730.
