

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

It has long been the United Methodist tradition to serve Holy Communion on the first Sunday of the month. This tradition evolved in the days of the Methodist Circuit Riders. Circuit Riders went from town to town on horseback to preach, teach and serve The Lord's Supper. These preachers would visit your community about once a month. Hence, the tradition of monthly communion was born.

John Wesley founded what became the Methodist Movement. Wesley was a proponent of constant communion. He encouraged people to come to the Lord's Table as often as it was available. Wesley believed that we could experience forgiveness, reconciliation, and grace each time we come to the table. Wesley also felt that the Communion Table was the place we most connected in love with each other. It makes sense that Wesley wanted his movement to experience the sacrament as often as possible.

I love Holy Communion. I love coming to the table. I love serving at the table. I have had some of my most profound worship experiences in the breaking of bread and sharing of the cup. Like Wesley, I sometimes wish we offered more frequent communion.

So beginning this Sunday through the Lenten season, we will serve communion each Sunday. It is my prayer that this change of routine will deepen our connection to Christ and to each other. Each week we will experience the sacrament in interesting and creative ways. As always, the Communion Table is open. Everyone is welcome to come and receive the blessings of our tradition.
