




PASTOR CHAT-SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 25

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I came home from our Ash Wednesday Service to the news that there was a mass shooting during the Super Bowl Parade in Kansas City. The news reported that this was the 45th shooting this year and that to date, 75 people have lost their lives and more than 150 have been injured.

My heart continues to break for those impacted by these shootings. I know there will be lots of policy debates that will happen and lots of noise in the media about what we should or should not do to stop these acts of violence.

As I prayed over these moments and all the trauma that it has inflicted on our communities, I kept asking the Lord, "What can I do? What is my role as a Spiritual Leader?"

I waited in silence and then began to journal. And the words that I believe the Holy Spirit placed on the page were simply this: "Keep my table open, Jeff."

That I can do!

The open Communion Table offers a powerful symbol to the world.

In the midst of division it offers unity. In the midst of scarcity it offers abundance. In the midst of indifference it offers hospitality. In the midst of despair it offers hope.

And in the face of death, an open Communion Table offers the promise of resurrection!

Please know that I am not saying that simply coming to the communion table more often will end gun violence. That would be naive and dangerous.

However, I am saying that one thing the church can offer the world is a radically different image of how we can live together. And an open, inclusive, invitational and expanding table helps us to imagine that kind of world.

The Communion Table is one of few places where we experience the truth of Mother Teresa's words: "We have no peace, because we have forgotten we belong to each other."

We have work to do.

We will do the work while continuing to invite as many who will come to the table of God's radical and redeeming love.
