

be set up at the Connections Table on Sunday mornings. If you prefer to shop from home and have it delivered, simply scan the QR code to order from our Amazon Wish List








WE NEED YOU...TO JOIN OUR CHOIR CAMP STAFF!

WOMEN'S RETREAT



Every Sunday night, our Youth Group gathers for fellowship and activities to grow in our relationship with God and with each other. A big part of this is having dinner



This Lent, we have leaned into our longstanding tradition of serving fish dinners with a renewed enthusiasm. We have had two dinners with over 90 volunteers and served nearly 700 meals.

This season we have reminded ourselves of why we do these dinners.

- To experience the joy of being in the Body of Christ. When we all come together as
 one, good things happen, friendships are formed and Christ's love is multiplied.
 Whether you wash the dishes, bread the fish, pour the coffee, sell the tickets, or play
 the piano (thank you, Leonard!), when we each do our part something truly beautiful
 takes place.
- 2. We offer Christian hospitality to every person who walks through the door. We remind ourselves before we open the doors that every single person who walks through the door is a precious child of God. We do our best to be patient and kind to everyone. At our fish dinners we try to remind ourselves that Jesus came to serve, not to be served.
- 3. We raise funds to support our Children, Youth and Families programming. Every \$500 raised sends a young person to summer camp! In addition, these resources will support our Holy COW and ROY Youth Group weekly meals.
