#### **GET READY FOR "EGG MY HOUSE"!**



Every Sunday night, our Youth Group gathers for fellowship and activities to grow in our relationship with God and with each other. A big part of this is having dinner together.



## LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Greetings Friends,

Last year, I was in the Smoky Mountains on our church's annual Spring Trek. Most of the group was ahead of me because, well, I'm the slowest hiker ever. My trail name is "Caboose" because I'm always last. Anyway, as I was trudging along, I passed a young girl and she looked familiar to me, and then I saw a woman who looked familiar, and then I had to stop and turn to realize my cousin and his family were passing the other way on the trail! I had not seen my cousin, Joel, in probably 20 years. I see his pictures on Facebook so that's how I recognized his wife and daughter. But since they live in Wisconsin and I live in Michigan, it's fair to say it was a surprise to run into them in Tennessee!

You might have a similar story of not recognizing someone at first because they are out of context somehow. Times when you had to do a double take because the person you were seeing just did not fit into the context you were in. It speaks to how our brain groups and categorizes people and places. It's probably a good thing our brains do that, but it can cause some real confusion in moments like these.

This week, we will hear the story of the two guys who are on the road to Emmaus and don't realize that Jesus is walking with them. How did they come to recognize him eventually? The answer holds some ideas for what it means to be a community of faith.
