






PRIDE & ALLY GROUP BRUNCH

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Welcome to Holy Week!

This is the week where the central story of our faith plays out in all its detail. By the end of this week, we will wave palms with enthusiasm, we will sit in the intimacy of an upper room and we will sit in shock at the foot of the cross. The story of Jesus' last week can truly come to life for us when we are present to both retell and relive these critical moments.

Palm Sunday: This Sunday at both the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. services, we will have the opportunity to wave the palms and join the parade as we remember how Jesus entered Jerusalem on the back of a donkey. It is a day of celebration, joy and a commitment to the mission of life and justice even in the face of insurmountable odds.

Maundy Thursday: On Thursday, we remember Jesus' last supper and the radical act of foot washing on the eve of his arrest. Maundy comes from the Latin word "mandatum" which means we get the word mandate. The Gospel of John tells us that on that night, Jesus gave us a new commandment, a new mandate: "Love each other. Just as I have loved you, so you also must love each other". Join us at 7:00 p.m. for an reflective service of prayer, music and communion.

Good Friday: On Friday, we will recall and relive Jesus' arrest, trial and crucifixion. The irony of calling this day good should not be lost on any of us. The Old English understanding of the word good is closer to what we would now call holy. This is a Holy day where we glimpse the extent to which God will go to stand in solidarity with a suffering world. We will offer two chances to experience this day. At 12:00 p.m., a Tenebrae Service, a service of entrusting the light, where we highlight the drama of the last hours of Jesus' life. At 7:00 p.m., our annual 7 Last Words Poetry & Music Slam will highlight the words Jesus spoke from the cross as only artists can truly do. This is a unique service that you should really experience.

Easter: The week culminates the following Sunday at both 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. as we are reminded of the great pattern of resurrection that is woven throughout all of creation. Out of death God always brings new life.

I hope you come and be part of the grand retelling of our story.

We will truly proclaim the mystery of our faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P.S. – This Tuesday, I will be hosting a Holy Week Happy Hour at the Tap House at 7:00 p.m. for all the men of the church. This is a chance for fellowship, to make new friends and reacquaint with guys you have known for a while. Join me for a Diet Coke, a cup of coffee, a glass of wine or whatever else you enjoy. We will be glad to see you.
