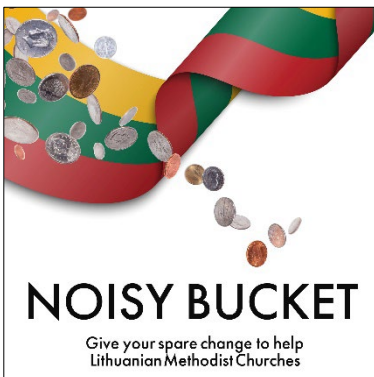
SAVE THE DATE! FOR ZOOM CHURCH-WIDE MEETING FOCUSED ON RESULTS FROM VISIONING DAY

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I learned a new word this week- Coddiwomple. Coddiwomple is an English slang word meaning to “travel purposefully toward an as-yet-unknown destination.”

We are in the midst of a Coddiwomple right now at Royal Oak First. On March 9th we gathered with over 80 people for a day of listening and discernment about where God might be leading our movement. The day generated a lot of conversation and some focus around who we are and who we are becoming.

We heard things like:

- Wanting to learn to live the love of Jesus
- Wanting to be a part of the “beloved community”
- Creating lots of opportunities to connect with each other for friendship and growth
- Being a place that lives out its faith in acts of justice and mercy
- Being a resource to help with basic needs both inside and outside the church
- Leaning into our strengths of being an intergenerational community with a commitment and focus on children, family and youth strengths

These are just a few of the long list of things we heard throughout the day.

Since that meeting, the staff has met a couple of times with members of the Compass Team and some other members of the congregation to begin to discern and distill where the Spirit might be calling us to go.

Discernment, like any good Coddiwomple, takes time, intention and invitation for others to join the journey. So I am inviting YOU to join me, members of our staff and the Compass Team, to a virtual Town Hall Meeting on Sunday, April 28 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting will be on Zoom and the link will be provided as we get closer to the day. That evening we will review the journey, share initial findings, receive your feedback and talk about next steps on the journey.

Together we are headed somewhere - somewhere we are not quite certain of yet - but we are moving there together. That is what discernment is all about.

So welcome to this wonderful Coddiwomple. There is no community I would rather do this with than with all of you!
