SAVE THE DATE! FOR ZOOM CHURCH-WIDE MEETING FOCUSED ON RESULTS FROM VISIONING DAY

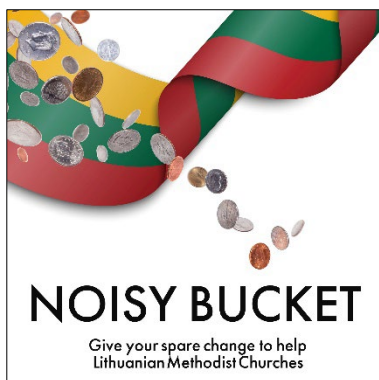

LETTER FROM OUR PREACHER

Good Morning,

For those of you who I haven't met yet, let me introduce myself. I am Nicole Wilson, the resident "spiritual director". If you are unfamiliar with the term, you join the majority of Americans. A simple definition is that I have training to companion people on their journeys with God.

In my first career I was an English teacher, so it is safe to say I have always been intrigued by the things we can learn about ourselves and others through the stories we tell and the stories we hear. I pursued training as a spiritual director because I want to listen well to people's stories, and I want to help people listen to themselves.

One of the first things I learned in this training is that in order to listen, first, I have to abide. I have to choose to be present to the person I'm with. This isn't naturally easy for me. Sometimes I would rather do the talking, but I learn more (about others and myself) when I am listening.
