## LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Friends,

This week's Scripture (Matthew 21:12-17) shows us a side of Jesus we don't always talk about...the table-flipping Jesus. Not just gentle, soft-spoken, lamb-holding Jesus, but bold, brave, justice-seeking Jesus.

He walks into the temple, sees how the poor are being taken advantage of, and he just acts. With fire in his heart and compassion in his bones, he flips the tables that were keeping people from God. It was loud, messy, risky but necessary.

So I ask you...what are the tables that still need flipping? What systems, unspoken rules or cultural norms are keeping people out, making them feel less than? And do we have the courage to speak up, to live differently, to step out in faith even if it costs us something?

Jesus didn't turn tables out of anger he did it out of love. Love for the people being shut out, love for the ones the world had forgotten. And maybe that's our call, too: not just to admire his courage, but to share it.

Let's ask ourselves honestly: What in our lives or in our community might need to be turned over, cleared away, or rethought? What would it look like for us to live with that kind of bold, loving heart?
