



LETTER FROM OUR PREACHER

Dear Friends,

Today in the church calendar, we celebrate the Holy Trinity. The Trinity, though a cornerstone of Christian faith and theology, is still something of mystery. Because three "persons" (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) are one God, which is a difficult concept to wrap one's head around, theologians have spent the last 1700 years or so trying to define and explain exactly how that is, and what it means for us. Spoiler alert: we will never fully understand every aspect of God.

No matter how many boxes we try to put God in, God's expansiveness is greater than those boxes or any limitations we might try to impose. Luckily, Jesus gives us the gift of Spirit to help to understand what God is saying to us in our own time, even if we don't have all the answers about who God is.

Today's scripture reading continues the Pentecost theme of the Holy Spirit. In this passage, Jesus is speaking to the disciples before his arrest, trial, and crucifixion. He is giving his last bit of teaching and trying to impart as much wisdom as he can in these last few hours before his death. Jesus promises that the Spirit will be the disciple's guide and comfort after he is no longer physically present. While these words were said to Jesus' followers in their time, they are also for us now as a reminder that we have a supporter and connection to God through the Spirit still working and active in our world today.

I pray that your summer is a time of rest, relaxation, and renewal! Enjoy the nice weather, your vacations and trips, your cottages, watching the Tigers, or whatever your summer traditions may be.

Remember that we are still here at Royal Oak First every Sunday and you can always watch worship online during the livestream, or later in the week when you are away.
