LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I'm thrilled to report that, by the grace of God (and perhaps a little technological wizardry), we've successfully delivered this week's bulletin and letter electronically! A big thank you for your patience during our hiccup—your grace means the world.

As I reflect on the past week, my heart is full. Over the Fourth of July weekend, our Outreach on 7th welcomed 63 neighbors who are facing hunger or homelessness. We served up hotdogs, hamburgers, and watermelon, transforming the day into a genuine celebration of community. I had a conversation with Roger Boyer, one of our devoted volunteers, about where he felt he saw God that day. He shared a moving story about a guest who, despite his own circumstances, presses a crumpled dollar bill into the hands of one of our clothing closet workers every time he visits, saying, "this is for the church." It struck me how even the smallest gestures can carry such dignity and grace, allowing everyone the chance to contribute in their own way.

Then, on Saturday, we hosted 56 neighbors at our Essentials Pantry, where we provide hygiene supplies for those in need. I asked Ann Brown, one of our amazing lead servants, where she saw God in that moment. With a smile, she spoke of Gavin, a young boy who volunteers with us. "Watching Gavin Luczak's servant heart beating at such a young age!" she exclaimed. It warmed my heart to think of how even our children are stepping up to love and serve others.

On another exciting note, I am overjoyed to introduce Sarah Vandervest as our new Sunday School Coordinator! Sarah has such a big heart for kids and a genuine passion for sharing Jesus' love with them. We'll introduce her this Sunday, and I can't wait to see the incredible ways she'll connect with our students and help them grow in their faith.

Let's continue to support one another, share our stories, and extend the love of Christ in all that we do. Together, we are making a difference!
