# LETTER FROM OUR PREACHER

Friends,

When I was in Junior High, I had a paper route. I enjoyed the walking and the money, but dealing with the customers wasn't my strong suit.

One of my customers had just gotten new concrete front steps poured the day before, and there was still yellow tape around them. It was hard to reach their front porch with the steps cordoned off. I wondered if the concrete had already dried. It looked dry, but was it really?

To find that out, I would have to test it. I bent over and reached my finger out to touch the step in a tiny, out of the way corner. Just then, the customer suddenly appeared on the porch and loudly accused me of attempting to write something in the wet concrete. I told him, no, I was testing it to see if I could walk on it. He kept yelling so I handed him his paper and left.

I was trying to do the right thing, but he didn't believe me! That wasn't fair. I was being responsible, but I got yelled at anyway. Sometimes life is unfair. It happens to everyone at some point in their life. It happened to Joseph in the book of Genesis a lot.
