LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Hey friends,

Whenever I close my eyes and think about my childhood, I can picture myself in the back seat of that old beige Buick from the mid-seventies, squished next to my brother. My parents were in the front, and man, those were the days before air conditioning—windows down, and my dad's comb-over was taking a wild ride in the wind! Almost every other weekend, we'd pile into that car for a two-and-a-half-hour trek to my grandparents' house. We were the family that lived "far away," and my mom always wanted to connect with her people. I can still hear my dad's voice ringing out, "Don't make me pull this car over!" whenever my brother and I started bickering.

Those long car rides were where my love for music really took root. We sang our hearts out to Johnny Cash and Elvis on the 8-track. But, without fail, every journey to Grandma's turned into a mini church session with us belting out hymns—radio off, just our voices filling the car. Songs like "Amazing Grace," "Blessed Assurance," "The Old Rugged Cross," and "Great is Thy Faithfulness" are forever etched in my memory. Now that both my parents have passed on, singing those hymns is my way of feeling close to them. I find myself hopping in the car, driving around, and just letting it all out. (Excuse me for a second—looks like I might need a Kleenex. My eyes are getting a little misty.)

So, this summer, I'd love for you to join me in singing those cherished hymns. Over the next few weeks, we'll dive into the stories behind these classics and the faith they inspire. The church is always evolving, but there are some beautiful things worth holding onto and those hymns are definitely at the top of my list. This week, we'll explore how a former slave ship captain became a priest and went on to write one of the most famous hymns ever.

And hey, if you've got a passion for music, this is a fantastic time to get involved in our music ministry here at Royal Oak First! I'd love for you to consider joining the choir, where we keep those traditional hymns and anthems alive. Michael Rosas, our amazing director, would be thrilled to chat with you about how you can share your voice and gifts.

I'm really looking forward to singing alongside all of you this summer!
