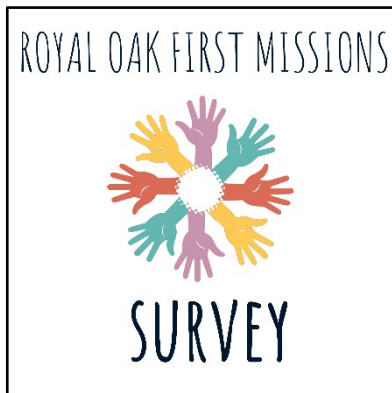

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Beloved Community,

As I write this letter, my heart feels heavy with the sorrow of yet another tragic shooting. I know many of you share in this pain, and the emotions we are experiencing—sadness, anger, and helplessness—can feel like an avalanche, making it hard to find our footing in a world that seems so divided right now.

In these moments, I often find hope in Paul's words to the Philippians: "Be of the same mind as Jesus." This simple reminder encourages me to look to Jesus, who chose service over self, as my guiding light. I'll admit, there are times when I feel the urge to jump into arguments online, to shout "Stop it!" at the top of my lungs. But then I hear Paul whispering to me: "Do nothing from selfish ambition or empty conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves." (Philippians 2:3).

Jesus' example nudges me to change my perspective. Instead of getting caught up in disagreements with my neighbors (both next door and online), I pause and ask myself, how can I serve them? There are so many small, meaningful ways to connect—whether it's sharing a meal, mentoring a child, or simply visiting an elder. These acts of love, alongside our calls for justice, can help bridge those seemingly vast divides. It may feel a bit naive, but this is the hope that stirs within me today.

I've spoken with many of you about the limitations of "thoughts and prayers," and I completely understand. It can feel insufficient when confronted with such profound tragedy. But for me, prayer is like the air I breathe. It's where I find my strength and vision for a world that embraces peace. I don't pray for God to fix everything for us; I pray for God to cultivate a spirit of Jesus within me and among all of us. My hope is that we can embody the same heart and mind He had, so that together, we can show the world a different way—one grounded in love and compassion. We truly need this.

Remember, Jesus never picked up a weapon against his enemies; instead, he picked up a basin and towel and chose to wash their feet. As we navigate these challenging times, let's commit ourselves to being instruments of peace and love, embodying the heart of Christ in all we do.

I'm walking this journey with you, and together, we can create ripples of hope in our community.
