
NOAH SANDWICH ASSEMBLY FROM HOME



LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Beloved Community,

I hope this message finds you well.

As I write, I still feel the weight of the challenges we face together. The rise of authoritarianism, the targeting of vulnerable communities, and the heartbreaking conflicts in Europe and the Middle East often leave me heavy-hearted.

Yet, I experienced a delightful surprise this past week; I reconnected with my old friend Paul, who has been living in New Zealand for two years. He's deep into a PhD in philosophy, identifying himself as a "public philosopher." When I asked him about his work, he said, "I really help people think about the everyday ways we build meaning, connection, and moral courage." The question at the center of his work is, "What makes life good, really?"

We shared breakfast on Saturday sitting outside Pronto. (A pastor and a philosopher walk into a breakfast joint...sounds like the start of a good joke!) Paul shared how wonderful it is to be back "home," reminiscing about the joy of sitting in the stands at Tiger Stadium, the warmth of attending a friend's wedding, and the sweetness of being present for his grandchild's baptism. He also reflected on the bittersweet visit he had with a dear friend undergoing chemotherapy treatments, wondering if this might be their last time together this side of heaven. I left breakfast thinking everyone should have a "public philosopher" to help them through the noise.

Paul shares his writings on a platform called Substack, which I had to ask my kids to help me navigate! I found one of his recent pieces about his trip home, beautifully capturing the essence of our conversation—the moments we often overlook. He closed with a thought that resonated deeply:

"If we don't pause to honor what is good, really—then all our fighting, all our traveling, all our striving doesn't add up to much...The work of truth and resistance matters. But so does the wedding toast, the ballgame cheer, the hospital bedside, and the shared act of making stories. What makes life good, really, is showing up for all of it."

Amen to that!

This is the balance we seek at Royal Oak First. We are a community that fights for what matters while savoring the beauty of the moment right in front of us.

We want to help each other discover, "What makes life good, really?"

Thank you for being on this journey with me—your presence, love, and compassion make a difference.

Your presence matters. It really does!
