

LETTER FROM OUR PREACHER

Dear Beloved Community,

Pastor Jeff always begins his letters to us in this way, speaking to us how he sees us, reminding us of the privilege our name grants us. We are part of a beloved community, and we get to see ourselves and those around us as both beloved and part of community.

This week's theme is "Come and See," and one aspect of seeing is experiencing rather than watching or observing. So, in this fall season, I encourage you to live into the experience of being a beloved community. There are several ways you can do this. One is to join a small group. The book we are using this fall, "Makin' It Real: Embracing Connections with Christ," was written by Pastor Jeff with our community in mind, and it is available on Amazon. (All royalties from the book come right back to Royal Oak First!) This book gives us some great personal practices for building our connection with Jesus and knowing we are the beloved of God.

Another way to experience community here, is to participate in one of our "Service for Others" projects, or to join an affinity group like the Pride & Ally Group kicking off in October, or to volunteer on a ministry team. If you aren't sure where the best place for you is, I encourage you to talk to any staff member about taking a step to let yourself be seen in a new way as you seek to build and help expand our beloved community.
