We hope this helps make Advent even more meaningful as you celebrate with your loved ones at home!



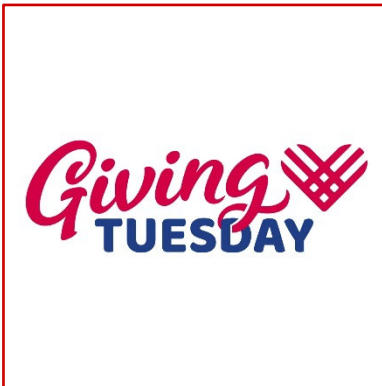

For this year’s Advent Mission Project, we will be **collecting children’s Christmas gifts for area families who are struggling financially.** We have two different ways to do this:

If you are feeling especially generous, reach out to Karla at missions@rofum.org and you can **adopt a whole family of children** through the Metro Detroit Youth Club, based in Royal Oak. You will be asked to purchase two gifts and a stocking stuffer for each child in the family. Families range in size, so you can request the size of family you are able to support, ranging from 1-6 children.

Alternatively, you can **bring in fun, unwrapped gifts of your choice.** Check out the “giving tree” on the Connections Table for ideas if you need them. Shop for your items and return them to the Missions collection bin (located by the Welcome Desk) by December 14. These gifts will help stock the Cass Community Social Services Christmas Store where nearly 300 families in Detroit will “shop” for their kids’ Christmas gifts.
