

## FAMILY SHELTER MEALS (DINNER HELP)




#### **CHURCH OFFICE HOLIDAY HOURS**

# LETTER FROM OUR PREACHER

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent. I am struck by the visions of peace in today's scripture, not just the peace between peoples and nations, but also the peace of our physical earth home.
