



LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Beloved Community,

You remember those old black-and-white movies, right?

There's some looming trouble threatening the whole town. The clock is ticking. The only way through is to raise an impossible amount of money...and then—cue the music—Mickey Rooney and Judy Garland step forward and say, "Let's put on a show!"

And somehow—through singing and dancing and laughter—the whole town shows up. Joy breaks out. And by the final curtain call, the money is raised and the day is saved.

Well...that's basically what we're doing this Sunday. We're putting on a show.

Our annual Spaghetti Dinner & Variety Show is happening this Sunday, and it's one of the most joy-filled nights of the year. We've got nearly twenty acts, featuring people of all ages and stages—kids, adults, first-timers, seasoned performers—all sharing their gifts for the sheer delight of it.

Dinner is at 5:00 pm. The show starts at 6:00 pm.

So come hungry. Bring a friend. Stay for the whole show. Good food. Good people. And a chance to do some real good in our community.
