

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Beloved Community,

In my closet there hangs a blue sport coat covered in gold sequins. It is straight out of a 1970s lounge act. It shines louder than it should. It has no business still existing. I can't wear it anymore. I long ago outgrew it. But it remembers a moment.

Eighth grade. I was bigger than most of the kids in my class. I sat in the back of every classroom—quiet, uncertain, a little afraid. Trying not to be noticed.

Mrs. Vevea was my English teacher. She was tough. The kind of teacher who didn't let you coast. But she cared. And somewhere in the middle of red ink and grammar lessons, she saw something in my writing. She saw a kid with words that wanted to be shared.

So when the eighth-grade talent show came along, she asked that quiet, oversized boy in the back of her class to be the emcee...and she handed him a sparkle coat.

It wasn't the coat that mattered. It wasn't even the moment on stage. It was the noticing.

Being seen did something to me. It loosened something. It cracked open a shell I didn't even know I was living inside. I discovered a sense of call because one English teacher paid attention.

I guess that's part of why I love our church's variety show so much. When someone is noticed. When a room cheers. When a community says, "We see you." Something holy happens. A shell breaks. A voice strengthens. A life shifts.

Lent is here. Our whole season is called "Seen and Called."

When you read the Gospels, you begin to notice how often Jesus sees people. Really sees them. Fishermen mending nets. Sisters busy in the kitchen. A tax collector hiding in a tree. He sees people in the middle of their actual lives. And in the act of being seen, something loosens. People stand a little straighter. They breathe a little deeper. They discover courage they didn't know they had. And then—they are called. Not into spotlight moments necessarily. But into lives of love and service.

Your pastoral staff spent much of this winter writing a companion book for this journey, also called "Seen and Called." It is designed to walk with us through Lent, exploring these encounters and asking where we, too, are being seen—and where we might be called. Make sure you grab a copy. Join a group. Enter the discovery. Royal Oak First wants to be a place that sees like Jesus sees.

Because sometimes all it takes is...one teacher, one moment, one community...to change a life.
