

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Beloved Community,

Lent is right around the corner.

Every year, it arrives quietly and insistently—like a hand on the shoulder, or a question we didn’t know we were ready to ask. Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 18, and with it comes an invitation to slow down, tell the truth, and remember who we are.

On Ash Wednesday, we’ll be offering ashes throughout the day from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Lafayette Street entrance—a simple, come-as-you-are moment to pause and mark the day. That evening, we’ll gather for a soup supper at 6:00 p.m., followed by worship with ashes at 7:00 p.m. There is something grounding about beginning this season together—around tables, in prayer, with honest words on our foreheads.

What I’m especially excited about this Lent is our Lenten Small Groups Book Study, “Seen and Called.”

This is a book written and designed by our Pastoral Team, created with this community in mind. Each week, we’ll spend time with a different encounter Jesus has—with real people living real lives. Peter. Martha and Mary. Zacchaeus. And others. Again and again, we see Jesus notice people where they actually are—not where they wish they were—and then call them into God’s ongoing work in the world.

That movement matters. To be seen. And then to be called.

I hope you’ll plan to read “Seen and Called” over the Lenten season. Even more, I hope you’ll consider joining a small group where we can read, listen, wonder, and learn together—trusting that God is still at work in us and among us.

Lent isn’t about getting it right. It’s about showing up. About being honest. About discovering—sometimes again—that grace was already there.
