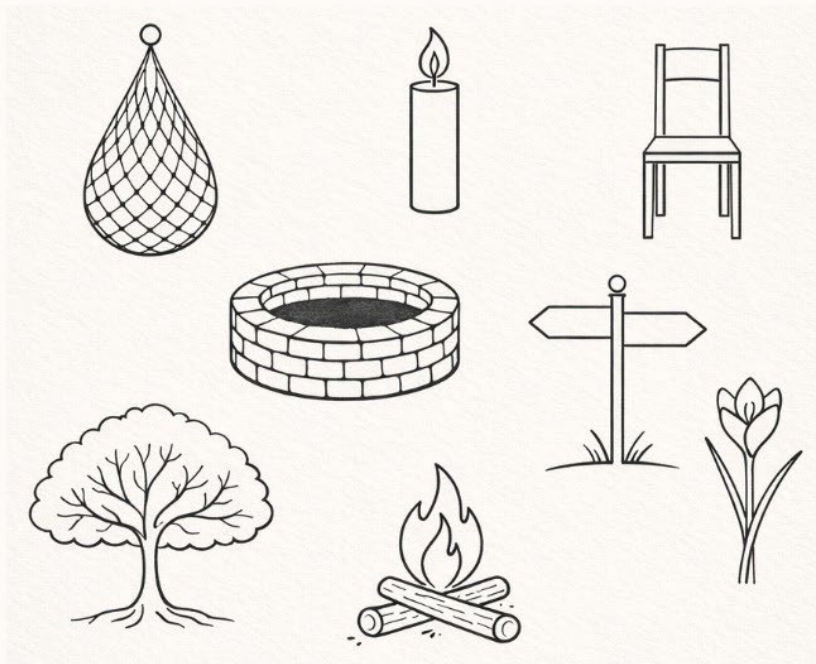

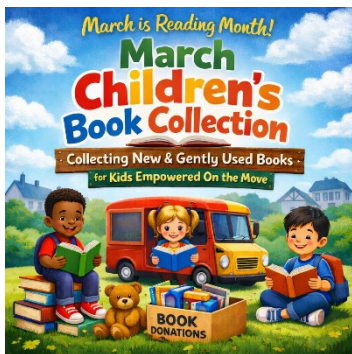


EASTER EGG FILLERS COLLECTION
