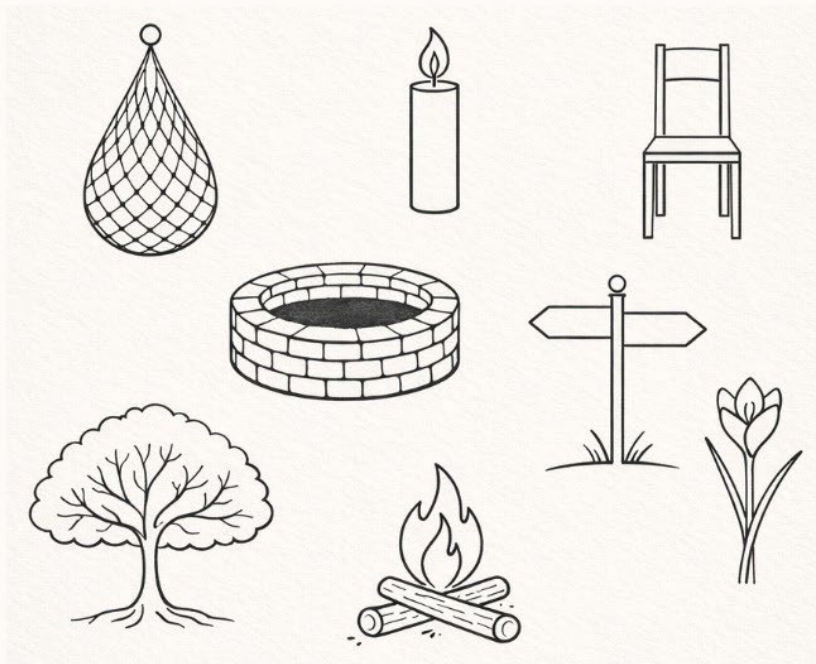

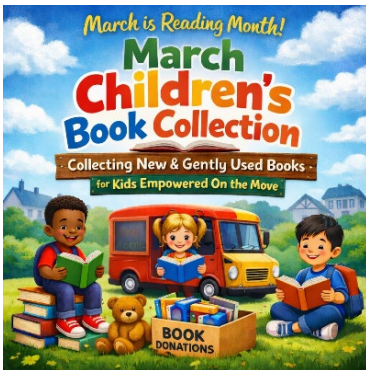

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Beloved Community: An Alternative Vision

We are living in a time that trains us to sort people—by politics, by income, by zip code, by who “deserves” help. But the gospel keeps offering an alternative vision: Beloved Community. A world where people are not problems to manage, but neighbors to welcome. A world where no one is disposable.

One of the clearest places we see that alternative vision taking shape is around food.

On Wednesday evening, Holy COW fed more than 100 children and parents. It’s more than a meal. It’s a space where families are welcomed, kids can be kids, and community forms.

Right here in our building, Outreach on 7th continues daily, making sure unhoused neighbors and those in vulnerable situations have food and care. Fridays are especially full: the clothing closet, laundry, showers, and connections to county and city resources—along with the steady gift of a meal and a warm welcome. This is Beloved Community in action.

Our Lenten Fish Dinners carry that same spirit. Yes, they support ministry—but they are far more than a fundraiser. They are a chance to work shoulder to shoulder and offer hospitality to the wider community. Last week we served over 500 meals. People come for the food, and they return for the welcome.

And throughout the winter we’ve partnered with the new family shelter in Pontiac, one of the few family shelters in Oakland County. Royal Oak First has provided 300 meals a month—a total of 1,200 meals this winter—supporting about 50 families as they work toward stability.

This is what an alternative vision looks like: ordinary people showing up with care, food becoming community, and the church practicing the world we pray for. Thank you for being part of it.
